Summit II is the second in a series of summits convening leaders of Hawaiian self-governance initiatives to further discussion and collaboration regarding plans to advance Hawaiian self-determination.

Ea represents sovereignty, rule, and independence as embodied in the words that Kauikeaouli uttered on Lā Ho'ihō'i Ea, Sovereignty Restoration Day. Kāmau means "to keep on, continue, persevere, last, add a little more" and speaks to the efforts of those who have endeavored and persevered since 1893 to restore Ea to Hawaiians.
